

# The Experiment in International Living Request for Proposals

Submission Deadline: Monday, April 8, 2024

On behalf of World Learning and The Experiment in International Living, this solicitation serves to announce an open competition for youth-focused international partner organizations to host selected Experiment exchange participants participating in Summer **2025 Experiment Programs.** Through this competitive process, The Experiment seeks to partner with youth-focused organizations in program countries to implement a comprehensive three- to four-week experiential exchange for high school-aged exchange participants.

#### **COMMENCEMENT AND DURATION OF AGREEMENT:**

Upon selection for partnership by The Experiment, organizations will be eligible to implement Experiment programs for a period of 5 years.

Detailed information, specific to The Experiment Programming and model can be found in the attached annexes.

This call for proposals seeks International Partner Organizations who can implement in-country exchange programs, accomplishing these goals by providing services that combine impact-oriented programming with an effective curriculum curve and successful monitoring of participants.

### **PROCUREMENT OF INTERNATIONAL PARTNER ORGANIZATIONS:**

The International Partner Organization procurement process is conducted in the following manner:

- Proposals will be reviewed and ranked by an Experiment Technical Committee for program content and administration, and other criteria spelled out in this solicitation.
- The Technical Committee will use information provided by international partner organizations, as well as any information and data generated through the implementation of past Experiment exchange programs, and its own research to select the most suitable partners.



• Upon selection by the technical committee, The Experiment will officially issue the 2025 Experiment exchange program(s) to your organization. Partners will be notified of the results of their submission via e-mail by mid-June.

This solicitation invites international partner organizations to submit a proposal describing specific and detailed capacity for organizing and implementing in-person programs for high school youth from the U.S.

International Partner Organizations must demonstrate experience and the capacity to provide participants with an experiential, educational exchange, and exposure to diverse local community life and culture. Experiment programs are designed to provide experiences that allow participants to explore the world through hands-on experiences in local communities and through the lens of a specific theme.

International Partner Organizations should submit a complete and thorough narrative describing their capabilities and experiences in a persuasive and comprehensive manner.

- Appendix 3: Preliminary Proposed Budget highlighting per participant costings based on 10-, 14-or 16 student participants + 2 adult group leaders.

# **Review Process**

Proposals will be reviewed for program content and other criteria spelled out in this solicitation by an Experiment Technical and Budget Committee. Each submission will be evaluated according to the following criteria:

#### TECHNICAL STRATEGY/APPROACH

- Programming Capability: International Partner Organization's demonstration of skills, experience, and expertise in the following: youth programming activities; management systems; and arranging experiential, educational programs, and cultural and social activities.
- Monitoring Procedures: International Partner Organization's ability to provide examples of program
  monitoring systems to ensure proper local volunteer assignments; experience managing crisis situations;
  ability to make appropriate program adjustments; and experience conducting program debriefs and
  evaluations.

#### MANAGEMENT AND STAFFING PLAN

The Management and Staffing Plan demonstrates the ability of International Partner Organization to manage program implementation efficiently and effectively:

• *Program Administration*: International Partner Organization's experience in staffing to manage exchange programs; health and safety preparedness; the organization's ability to deliver a cost-effective program.

#### **CAPABILITIES AND EXPERIENCE**

The capabilities and experience section focuses on the existing capabilities of the International Partner
Organization and its experience in providing similar services to those required in this RFP. Under this
evaluation factor, the Technical Committee will review the level of demonstrated capability and
experience in running similar exchange programs.
